

CHAP. 5

An Act respecting the Dairy School at St Hyacinthe

[Assented to 26th March, 1902]

WHEREAS the Dairy School established at St. Hyacinthe by the Dairy Society of the Province of Quebec no longer meets the requirements of the dairy industry of the Province, and the school building is, moreover, threatened with ruin owing to a subsidence of the land on which it is built ;

Preamble.

Whereas it is in the interest of the Province that a proper school be built on the site of the present school or in some other place ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. It shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to cause to be built, at St. Hyacinthe, on the site of the present dairy school or on some more advantageous site, a dairy school, at a cost of not more than fifteen thousand dollars.

Dairy School may be built at St. Hyacinthe.

2. It shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to purchase the land necessary for such school, and, if he deems it expedient, to enter into an agreement with the Dairy Society of the Province of Quebec and with any person interested for the purpose of becoming proprietor of the present dairy school and the land upon which it is built, and to pay for such purpose the amount agreed upon.

Land therefor may be purchased.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
