

That it is consequently necessary that the Board of Notaries of the Province of Quebec be authorized to admit him to practise the said profession as if he had been under regular indentures since the twenty-third of September, 1899 ;

That the said board has, by an authorization passed at their general meeting held on the tenth of July, 1900, consented to the passing of the present act ;

Whereas the said Percy Clare Duboyce has prayed that an act to that effect be passed, and it is expedient to grant his prayer ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The Board of Notaries of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Percy Clare Duboyce to the final examination for admission to practise the notarial profession, upon production of a diploma conferring upon the said Percy Clare Duboyce the degrees of the Law Faculty of Laval University and of a certificate from said John Fair, showing that the said Percy Clare Duboyce has attended his office during three years, and, after satisfactory examination, to admit him to practise the said profession.

CHAP. 120

An Act to authorize Joseph-Antoine Germano to practise the notarial profession in this province

[Assented to 26th March, 1902]

WHEREAS Joseph-Antoine Germano of the city of Preamble.
Montreal has, by his petition, represented :

That he practised the notarial profession in France for twenty-eight years, as attested by the certificate given him by the President of the Board of Notaries of Aix, in Provence, which certificate is annexed to the record ;

That, since his arrival in Canada on the 2nd February, 1888, that is to say, for the past fourteen years, the petitioner has constantly been connected with the notarial profession, and has never ceased to be employed as drafting clerk in important offices in Montreal ;

That various certificates from notaries who have employed him, and from other notaries, advocates and registrars, attest his qualifications as well as his respectability, and state that he is worthy of being admitted to the practice of the notarial profession in the Province of Quebec, without previous examination ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The Board of Notaries of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Joseph-Antoine Germano to the final examination for admission to practise the profession of notary, subject to the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 of article 3822 of the Revised Statutes, and upon his proving that he has conducted himself properly since his residence in the country.

CHAP. 121

An Act to authorize the Board of Notaries of the Province of Quebec to admit Léon-Domitien-Eugène Rousseau to the practise of the notarial profession

[Assented to 26th March, 1902]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Léon-Domitien-Eugène Rousseau, of the city of Quebec, advocate and notarial student has, by petition, represented :

That he has obtained the degree of Bachelor of Law at Laval University, that he was admitted to the Bar of this Province in July, 1894, and that since then he has practised the profession of advocate ;

That he has followed a complete course of classical studies, that he has not to undergo the examination for admission to the notarial profession, as he is a Bachelor of Letters of Laval University, and since the 30th August has served as a student with a practising notary ;

That, if he was obliged to continue his studentship in such quality of notarial student during three entire years, it would mean a useless loss of time on account of the knowledge and experience acquired by him during his study and practice of the legal profession ;
