CAP. I.

An Act granting to Her Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th June, 1897, and on the 30th June, 1898, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

[Assented to 9th January, 1897.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

WHEREAS it appears, by messages from His Honour, the Preamble.
Honourable Sir Joseph Adolphe Chapleau, K. C. M. G., Lieutenant-Governor of this Province, and the estimates accompanying the same, that the sums herein-after mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Government of the Province, not otherwise provided for, for the financial years ending on the 30th June, 1897, and on the 30th June, 1898, and for other purposes connected with the public service; May it, therefore, please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, that :

1. From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of this Province, there shall and may be taken a sum, not exceeding in the whole one hundred and eighty-seven thousand, three hundred and eighteen dollars and forty-two cents, for defraying the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, for the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1897, as set forth in Schedule A, annexed to this act. \$187,318.42 may be taken for the year ending 30th June, 1897, out of consolidated revenue fund, for purposes mentioned in Schedule A.

2. From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of this Province, a sum, not exceeding in the whole two million, one hundred and ninety-nine thousand and eighty-eight dollars and sixty-eight cents, may be taken for defraying, during the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1898, the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, as set forth in Schedule B, annexed to this act. \$2,199,088.68 may be taken for the year ending 30th June, 1898, out of consolidated revenue fund, for purposes mentioned in Schedule B.

Payments to be made subject to settlement of accounts with the Dominion and Ontario.

3. Every payment or application of moneys, appropriated by this act, shall be held to be made provisionally, and subject to all adjustment in account hereafter, in respect of the Dominion and of the Province of Ontario, and of special funds, which this act may in any manner affect.

Accounts to be rendered to both Houses of the Legislature.

4. Accounts, in detail, of all moneys expended under the authority of this act, shall be laid before both Houses of the Legislature of the Province, at the next session thereof.

Moneys expended to be accounted for to Her Majesty.

5. The application of all sums expended under the authority of this act shall also be accounted for to Her Majesty.

Coming into force.

6. This act shall come into force on the day of the sanction thereof.
