

power to lay the said pipe shall not be exercised until the city of Quebec shall, by a by-law of the council, have signified its consent thereto, that the works so authorized shall be carried on under the supervision and subject to the control of the city engineer, and that at the termination of the said works, the streets of the said city, in which works shall have been carried on under the authority of this act, shall be restored to the same condition as they were in prior to beginning the said works.

Responsibility
for damages,
&c.

2. The said Vesey Boswell, his heirs, executors and assigns shall be responsible for any loss, injury, accident or damage which may be caused by the said works so carried on by him or them, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the city of Quebec, of and from all claims and demands which may be made against it, by reason of such works.

Liability to
pay city
water-rate.

3. Notwithstanding that the said Vesey Boswell may obtain the supply of water necessary for his brewery situate on St. Vallier street, as aforesaid, by means of the pipe which he is hereby authorized to lay, he will remain liable to pay to the city of Quebec, the same water rates, as though such pipe had not been laid.

4. The water supplied by the said pipe shall be for the exclusive use of the brewery of the said Vesey Boswell, and shall not be supplied to other persons.

Coming into

5. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CAP. XCIX.

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Joseph Ena Girouard amongst its members.

[Assented to 9th January, 1897.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Joseph Ena Girouard, of the town of Drummondville, in the district of Arthabaska, a practising notary and member of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, has, by his petition, represented :

That he was admitted, according to law, to practise as a notary in the month of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one ; that he has always practised as such since then, and has acquired considerable knowledge and experience ;

Whereas he has prayed for the passing of an act, authorizing the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit him amongst its members ;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Joseph Ena Girouard amongst its members, after an examination on civil procedure in any case and also on the other subject unless the examiners of the Bar dispense therewith, and, as soon as he shall have been so admitted as an advocate, he shall cease to practise as a notary.

J. E. Girouard may be admitted to practise law after examination.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit P. Arthur Côté amongst its members, after examination.

[Assented to 9th January, 1897.]

WHEREAS Paul Arthur Côté, of the city and district of Montreal, was regularly admitted to the study of law at the beginning of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety ;

Preamble.

Whereas, after his admission, he followed the lectures at Laval University for two years and a half ;

Whereas he entered as a student with Messrs. Lacoste, Bisailon, Brosseau and Lajoie, advocates, of Montreal, on the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and studied in their office from that date to the first of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and from that date he studied as such with Messrs. Lussier and Gendron, advocates, of St. Hyacinthe, up to the first of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and afterwards with Messrs. Ouimet, Emard, Maurault and Ouimet, from the first of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and still studies there ;

Whereas, during the said period, he forgot to have an indenture passed with his various patrons, and moreover, inadvertently omitted to have his certificate of admission to study registered before the month of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six ;

Whereas, for the above reasons, it would be impossible for him to present himself for examination for admission to the profession of advocate before three years ;

Whereas the Council of the Bar of Montreal does not oppose his petition ;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :
