

## CAP. VIII.

An Act respecting the counsel for the Province of Quebec  
in the arbitration under the act 54 Victoria, chapter 4.

[Assented to 12th January, 1895.]

**W**HEREAS the Honourable J. S. Hall, Queen's Counsel, Preamble.  
and a member of the Legislative Assembly of this Province, did, while holding the position of Provincial Treasurer, devote much time and labour to the study of the questions of the claims and accounts between the Dominion of Canada and the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, and between the two Provinces, which have been submitted or are hereafter to be submitted to the arbitration of the arbitrators appointed under the act 54 Victoria, chapter 4, and has appeared before the said arbitrators as counsel for this Province; and whereas it is greatly in the interest of this Province that he should continue to represent it in the said arbitration;

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Honourable J. S. Hall shall not, by reason of his acceptance hereafter of the appointment of counsel for the Province in the arbitration under the act 54 Victoria, chapter 4, nor by his acceptance, in the future, of any fee or remuneration for his services as such counsel, since his resignation of the position of Treasurer, vacate or forfeit his seat as a member of the Legislative Assembly, or incur any of the penalties imposed by law. Hon. J. S. Hall not to incur any penalties, for receiving payment as counsel for Province in arbitration under 54 V., c. 4.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
