

CAP. LXXXII.

An Act to amend the act incorporating *L'Union St. Joseph de Lachine.*

[Assented to 8th January, 1894.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS *L'Union St. Joseph de Lachine* has, by its petition, alleged that by its act of incorporation it can admit only persons who are tradesmen, as members ;

Whereas the said union wishes to have removed from its act of incorporation everything that prevents persons other than those who are tradesmen from becoming members ;

Whereas it is expedient to grant its prayer ;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

41 V., c. 35, s. 10, repealed.

1. Section 10 of the act 41 Victoria, chapter 35, is repealed.

Coming into force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CAP. LXXXIII.

An Act to grant extended powers to the municipal corporations of the town of Nicolet and of St. Jean Baptiste de Nicolet.

[Assented to 8th January, 1894.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Nicolet, represented by its president, Bishop Elphège Gravel, by its petition, and the freehold inhabitants of St. Jean Baptiste de Nicolet, by a resolution to that effect, unanimously adopted at a regular meeting held on the twenty-sixth of November last, have prayed that power be granted to the municipal corporation of the town of Nicolet, and the municipal corporation of St. Jean Baptiste de Nicolet, to subscribe a certain amount for the rebuilding of the Roman Catholic cathedral of Nicolet ;

Whereas the municipal corporation of the town of Nicolet and the municipal corporation of St. Jean Baptiste de Nicolet consent to the passing of this act, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition ;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The municipal corporation of the town of Nicolet and the municipal corporation of St. Jean Baptiste de Nicolet may each subscribe a sum of eight thousand dollars for rebuilding the Roman Catholic cathedral of Nicolet, and, for that purpose, effect a loan, which shall be repayable at a long term if they so desire, and on such conditions as each of them may deem the best, and, for the repayment of the said sum, impose a tax on the taxable property of Roman Catholics of the parish of St. Jean Baptiste de Nicolet.

Certain subscriptions for rebuilding the cathedral of Nicolet authorized.

Tax to raise amount.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

An Act to authorize the *curé* and church-wardens of *l'œuvre et fabrique* of the parish of Ste. Scholastique, in the district of Terrebonne, to grant aid towards the rebuilding of the convent of the village of Ste. Scholastique.

[Assented to 8th January, 1894.]

WHEREAS the *curé* and church-wardens of *l'œuvre et fabrique* of the parish of Ste. Scholastique, in the district of Terrebonne, have, by their petition, prayed to be authorized to subscribe and pay, out of the revenues of the said *fabrique*, a sum of four thousand five hundred dollars, in aid of the rebuilding of the convent of the village of Ste. Scholastique ;

Preamble.

Whereas it is established that such is the almost unanimous wish and desire of the freeholders of the said parish of Ste. Scholastique, and whereas the petition is approved by His Grace the Archbishop of Montreal ;

Whereas it is also established that the suppression of the said convent, after an existence of nearly fifty years, would seriously injure the progress and prosperity of the parish of Ste. Scholastique ;

Whereas it is further established that the revenues of the said *fabrique* are sufficient to allow of such subscription, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition ;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The *curé* and church-wardens of *l'œuvre et fabrique* of the parish of Ste. Scholastique, in the district of Terrebonne, shall have the right, and they are hereby authorized to
