An Act to incorporate the Sunday School Union of the
 Province of Quebec.

[Assented to 12th July, 1888.]

WHEREAS Henry Lyman, J. Murray Smith, Seth P. Preamble.
 Leet, George Bishop, David Bentley, Reginald H.
 Buchanan, Geo. Hague, D. Torrance Fraser, Theodore

Lyman, L. H. Packard, Abner Kingman, William Tees, J. H. Carson, J. H. Cayford, Jas. Croil, James C. Holden and John E. Kirkpatrick, of the city of Montreal, have, by their petition, set forth that there has existed in the Province since the year 1836 an association known as the Canada Sunday School Union, having for its objects to promote the establishment of Sunday Schools and to encourage and strengthen those already in existence, and that the said Union has fulfilled the objects of its organization, and have prayed that the members of said Union be incorporated, under the name of the Sunday School Union of the Province of Quebec ;

And whereas it is expedient to grant such petition ;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

Persons incorporated.

1. Henry Lyman, J. Murray Smith, Seth P. Leet, George Bishop, David Bentley, Reginald H. Buchanan, Geo. Hague, D. Torrance Fraser, Theodore Lyman, L. H. Packard, Abner Kingman, William Tees, J. H. Carson, J. H. Cayford, Jas. Croil, James C. Holden and John E. Kirkpatrick, of the city of Montreal, and any others who may now be members of the Canada Sunday School Union, and all others who may hereafter become members, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, under the name of the "Sunday School Union of the Province of Quebec," with its head office in the city of Montreal.

Name.

Head office.

Objects of the Union.

2. The objects of the said Union are the promotion and encouragement of Sunday schools and their work in this Province.

Property vested in Union.

3. All the property and assets, moveable and immoveable, rights, claims and privileges of any nature and kind whatsoever, and wherever found or existing, which now belong to or which are held by, for or on behalf of the said Canada Sunday School Union, shall hereafter belong to the said Sunday School Union of the Province of Quebec, and the said Sunday School Union of the Province of Quebec shall be responsible and liable for all the debts, liabilities and obligations of the said Canada Sunday School Union.

Responsibility of Union for debts, &c.

Property to be held in its corporate name.

4. The property, rights and privileges of the said Sunday School Union of the Province of Quebec, shall be held in its corporate name ; and the said corporation shall have the right to receive and hold any property, either moveable or immoveable, by any title whatsoever, but the said Union shall not own beyond what is required for

its actual use, over and above the annual value of ten thousand dollars, for more than five years at any one time. Value of property limited.

5. Any sum of money or other property which may have already been or may hereafter be bequeathed, given or in any way devised, donated or set apart for the use or behoof of the Canada Sunday School Union shall be received by and used for the said Sunday School Union of the Province of Quebec. Money bequeathed, &c., to former Union to be received by Union incorporated by this act.

6. The business and property of the said Union shall be managed by a general committee, composed of twenty-one persons, who shall be members of said Union, and also members in good standing of some Evangelical Protestant Church, and of whom not more than five shall belong to any one denomination. Management of business of Union.

The said committee shall be elected for such term and in such manner as may be provided in the constitution and by-laws of said Union. Election of committee.

7. The constitution and by-laws now in force of the said Canada Sunday School Union shall be the constitution and by-laws of the said corporation until changed, according to the provisions thereof, except such as maybe inconsistent with this act or contrary to the laws of the Province of Quebec. Constitution and by-laws of Union.

8. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.

C A P . L X I I .

An Act to incorporate "*L'Union St. Joseph de St. Hyacinthe.*"

[Assented to 12th July, 1888.]

WHEREAS there exists, in the town of St. Hyacinthe, Preamble.
 an association, known under the name of "*L'Union St. Joseph de St. Hyacinthe,*" organized for the purpose of giving relief to its members, who might be unable to work, owing to illness or accident, and of paying a certain indemnity to the widows and children of deceased members or to their lawful heirs; whereas it is necessary, for the proper working and prosperity of the said association, that it should enjoy the rights, powers and privileges of an incorporated society; whereas the members of the association have, by their petition to the Legislature of this Province, prayed to be incorporated; and whereas it is expedient to grant their prayer;
