

## CAP. XCII.

An Act to amend the act 47 Victoria, chapter 91, intituled :  
 “ An Act to authorize the sale of certain immoveables  
 belonging to the estate of the late Jean Baptiste Re-  
 naud.”

[Assented to 21st June, 1886.]

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS Dame Sophie Lefebvre, of the city of  
 Quebec, widow of the late Jean Baptiste Renaud,  
 in his lifetime of the city of Quebec, merchant, has, by her  
 petition, represented that there are certain clerical errors  
 in the description of the real estate designated in the act  
 of this province, 47 Victoria, chapter 91 ;

Whereas the said act cannot be carried into effect unless  
 such errors be rectified, and it is expedient that the true  
 description of the said immoveables under the cadastre in  
 force in the province be substituted for the erroneous de-  
 scription aforesaid ; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with  
 the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts  
 as follows :

Certain im-  
 moveables in  
 Levis de-  
 signated.

1. The third paragraph of section 1 of the act 47 Vic-  
 toria, chapter 91, is replaced by the following :

“ The following immoveables situated in the town of  
 Levis :

1. Those designated, on the official plan and book of re-  
 ference of the cadastre of Notre-Dame ward, under the  
 numbers sixty-five (65) sixty-four (64) and sixty-three (63) ;

2. Those designated, on the official plan and book of re-  
 ference of the cadastre of Lauzon ward, under the numbers  
 three hundred and forty-three (343) three hundred and  
 forty-one (341) three hundred and thirty-nine (339) three  
 hundred and thirty-five (335) three hundred and thirty-  
 four (334) three hundred and twenty-nine (329) and three  
 hundred and twenty-eight (328) ;

3. Those designated, on the official plan and book of re-  
 ference of the cadastre of Notre-Dame ward aforesaid,  
 under the numbers fifty-eight (58) twenty-three (23)  
 nineteen (19) eighteen (18) forty-nine (49) forty-six (46)  
 fifty-five (55) and forty (40).”

Certain other  
 immoveables  
 designated.

2. The fifth paragraph of the said section is replaced  
 by the following :

“ The immoveable properties hereinafter described and  
 owned jointly by the late Jean Baptiste Renaud, Gaspard  
 LeMoine and Victor Chateauvert, to wit :

1. The immoveable situate in the parish of Saint-Sauveur de Québec, designated, on the official plan and book of reference of the said parish, under the number one (1).

2. The immoveable situate in the town of Levis, designated, on the official plan and book of reference of Saint Laurent ward, under the number one hundred and twenty-four (124).

3. A lot of land or emplacement situate in the second range of the parish of Rivière-du-Loup, on the Temiscouata road, containing one hundred feet in front, English measure, by the depth between the said Temiscouata road to the Rivière-du-Loup, bounded on the east by the said Temiscouata road, on the west by the Rivière-du-Loup, on the north by Mrs. Widow George Pelletier, and on the south by Mr. Wil. Paquet, with a house, shed, bakery and dependencies thereon erected."

### C A P. X C I I I .

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Louis Philippe Demers amongst its members, after examination.

[Assented to 21st June, 1886.]

**W**HEREAS Louis Philippe Demers, of St. Georges Preamble.  
d'Henryville, in the County of Iberville, was regularly admitted to study law on the fourteenth of July, eighteen hundred and eighty-three; whereas he has since that time followed the course of law lectures at Laval University, at Montreal; whereas he entered, at the end of August of the same year (1883), into an indenture with Messrs. Longpré and David, of Montreal, advocates, to study law under them, but, through inadvertency, this indenture was passed, before Mtre. H. A. A. Brault, notary, only on the fifteenth of October then following (1883); that, owing to this informality, he may be deprived of the benefit of six months of his legal studies; and whereas the Council of the Bar of Montreal assents to the demand of the petitioner; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec may admit the L. P. Demers  
said Louis Philippe Demers as an attorney and advocate may be ad-  
mitted to Bar,
