

## CAP. LVII.

## An Act to incorporate the Licensed Victuallers' Association of Montreal.

[Assented to 10th June, 1884.]

## Preamble.

WHEREAS H. Hogan, C. Larin, A. Dawes, C. Desmar-  
 tiau, L. A. Lapointe, J. Riendeau, J. Guest, C. S.  
 Reinhart, A. Compain, B. Tansey, E. L. Ethier, and a large  
 number of others, all licensed traders in the city of Montreal,  
 have, by petition, prayed for an act of incorporation under  
 the name of the "Licensed Victuallers' Association of  
 Montreal" and to be granted certain powers herein-  
 after mentioned, and it is expedient to grant their prayer;  
 Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and  
 consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

Certain per-  
sons incorpo-  
rated.

1. The persons above mentioned and others who are  
 already members, and all who may hereafter become mem-  
 bers, are constituted a body politic and corporate under  
 the name of the "Licensed Victuallers' Association of  
 city of Montreal."

Object of  
association.

2. The object of the association is to unite all the mem-  
 bers thereof into a society, in order to protect their rights  
 as license holders, and to maintain the respectability of the  
 members of the association, and to assist the authorities in  
 suppressing unlicensed establishments, and in causing the  
 license law to be respected.

Present rules,  
&c. continued.

3. The rules and regulations, now in force, concerning  
 the admission and expulsion of members and the general  
 management of the affairs of the association, in so far as  
 they are not inconsistent with the laws of this province,  
 shall be the rules and regulations of the corporation; pro-  
 vided always, that the corporation may, from time to time,  
 amend, repeal and alter such rules and regulations, wholly  
 or in part, in the manner prescribed by the by-laws then  
 in force.

Proviso as to

4. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a  
 president, vice-president, a secretary, a treasurer and a  
 board of directors, composed of six members, elected an-  
 nually at the general meeting held on the first Thursday  
 of January in each year, according to the rules and regu-  
 lations of the said association, and shall together constitute  
 the board of directors and shall remain in office until the  
 following annual election.

## Term of office.

All vacancies which may occur in the board of directors, <sup>Vacancies.</sup> by death or otherwise, shall be filled by the said board of directors according to the rules and regulations of the association.

5. H. Hogan, C. Larin, A. Dawes, C. Desmarteau, <sup>Provisional board.</sup> L. A. Lapointe, C. Reinhart, A. Compain, E. L. Ethier, B. Tansey, J. Guest and J. Riendeau shall form the board of directors until others are elected in their stead under the provisions of this act.

6. The corporation may, from time to time, purchase and <sup>Power of corporation to hold, &c., property.</sup> acquire, hold, take, own and possess for its use, movable and immovable property, provided the annual revenue therefrom does not exceed ten thousand dollars, and it may hypothecate, sell and dispose of the same and acquire others in lieu thereof whenever the said corporation shall deem proper.

7. No member or officer shall be in any manner respon- <sup>Members not personally liable for debts of corporation beyond unpaid subscription. Members may retire and how.</sup> sible or obliged to pay any debt or claim beyond the amount of his unpaid subscription; and any member of the association, who is not in arrear, may retire therefrom and cease to be a member thereof, by giving notice to that effect, in the manner required by the rules and regulations of the association, and thenceforth he shall be completely free from all responsibility arising from any debt or obligation of the association; and every member, who is expelled or who retires from the association, or whose name is struck from the list of members for any of the reasons mentioned in the rules and regulations, shall for- <sup>Rights forfeited if member retire, &c.</sup> feit all the rights which he enjoyed in his capacity of member of the said association.

CAP. LVIII.

An Act to incorporate "The Levis Maritime and Industrial Company."

[Assented to 10th June, 1884.]

**W**HEREAS the persons hereinafter mentioned have <sup>Preamble.</sup> prayed to be incorporated under the name of "The Levis Maritime and Industrial Company," and it is expedient to grant their prayer; therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:
