

CAP. XC VII.

An Act to authorize the Pharmaceutical Association of the Province of Quebec to admit Frederick T. Ansell to practice as a chemist and druggist in this Province.

[Assented to 10th June, 1884.]

WHEREAS Frederick T. Ansell, of the city of Sherbrooke, in the district of St. Francis, in this Province, has, by his petition, represented that he has been in the employ of Thomas J. Tuck and others, chemists and druggists, for eighteen years, and for that period has been actively engaged in the profession of chemist and druggist, and is now desirous of obtaining a license for authority to practice such profession; and whereas he has prayed that the Pharmaceutical Association may be authorized to grant him such license and to admit him as a member of the said association after examination, the said association having consented thereto, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of his petition; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for the Pharmaceutical Association of this Province, at any time after the passing of this act, to admit the said Frederick T. Ansell to practice the profession of chemist and druggist, and to issue a license for that purpose and to admit him as a member of the said association, as soon as he shall have passed an examination before the Board of Examiners of the said association, without his being required to attend the usual course of lectures.
