

1. The immoveable property bequeathed under the general name of the "lands at *La Tortue*," situate in the parishes of St. Philippe and of St. Constant, and designated, in the cadastre and book of reference of the said parish of St. Philippe, as numbers two hundred and sixty-two, two hundred and sixty-five and three hundred and thirty-six, and in the cadastre and book of reference of St. Constant, as numbers twenty-four, twenty-six and twenty-nine, by the late Alfred Pinsonneault, in his lifetime of the city of Montreal, esquire, advocate, to Alfred Charles Pinsonneault, Esquire, of the said city of Montreal, are declared to be free of substitution as to the said legacy and the said will and codicils; and the said Alfred Charles Pinsonneault is authorized to sell and dispose of the said immoveable property as he may deem proper.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CAP. LIII.

An Act to change the name of "The Orford Nickel and Copper Company."

[Assented to 30th March, 1883.]

WHEREAS the Orford Nickel and Copper Company, a body politic and corporate, duly incorporated under and by virtue of the fifty fourth chapter of the Statutes of the Province of Quebec, passed in the forty first year of the Reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, have by their petition represented that they are desirous of changing their corporate name, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The name of The Orford Nickel and Copper Company is hereby changed, and from and after the coming into force of this Act, the said company shall continue to exist, do business, and be known under the name of "The Orford Copper and Sulphur Company" but such change in the name of the said Company shall not affect any pending suits or cases, if any there be.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
