

for that purpose; and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Admission of G. A. Hughes, as an attorney and advocate after examination.

1. It shall be lawful for the Bar of the Province of Quebec, section of Montreal, at any time after the passing of this act, to admit the said George Arthur Hughes, as an attorney and advocate, and to practise law as such, as soon as he has passed the usual examination, after notice of one month of his intention to be examined, any law, usage or regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

C A P. C I.

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec, to admit Hormisdas Jeannotte, dit Lachapelle, as one of its members.

[Assented to 24th July, 1880.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Hormisdas Jeannotte, dit Lachapelle, of the city of Montreal, has, by petition, represented that he has studied law since the fifteenth of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven; that he has obtained from the Victoria University of Cobourg, Ontario, the degree of Bachelor at Law, and that he was admitted, after examination, to the practice of the profession of notary, and that he has practised, as such, in the city of Montreal, since the month of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy; whereas he desires to be admitted to practise the profession of advocate; and whereas he has prayed that an Act of this Legislature be passed and granted to him for that purpose; and, whereas it is expedient to grant such prayer; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Admission of H. J. Lachapelle, as an attorney and advocate after examination.

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec, section of the district of Montreal, at any time after the passing of this act, may, after examination, admit the said Hormisdas Jeannotte, dit Lachapelle, as attorney and advocate, and to practise law as such, as soon as he shall have passed the usual examination, after previously giving one month's notice of his intention to submit himself to such examination, any law, custom or by-law to the contrary notwithstanding.
