

C A P . X X I X .

An Act to amend chapter seventy-six of the Consolidated Statutes of Canada, respecting the practice of Physic and Surgery, and the Study of Anatomy.

[Assented to 24th December, 1872.]

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

Sec. 2 of C. S. C., c. 76, amended.

Certain bottles may be delivered for dissection.

1. The second section of the said act is amended so as to read in manner following :

“The bodies of persons found dead and publicly exposed, or of those who, immediately before death, had been supported by any public institution receiving aid from the provincial government, shall be delivered to the persons hereinafter mentioned, unless they be claimed within the usual period for interment, by relations not further removed than in the third degree, and such degree of relationship shall be established by the oath of the claimant.”

Inconsistent enactments repealed.

2. Any section of the said chapter seventy-six, or of any other act inconsistent with this act, is repealed.

C A P . X X X .

An Act for the civil erection of the Parishes of Saint Pierre de la Pointe aux Esquimaux, and of St. Ubalde.

[Assented to 24th December, 1872.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the parish of Saint Pierre de la Pointe aux Esquimaux, in the district of Saguenay, has been canonically erected by ecclesiastical authority, at the request of the parties interested, that is to say, by a canonical decree of the bishop of St. Germain de Rimouski, dated the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and is by the said canonical decree described and defined as having the extent and boundaries hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :

That part of the seigniory of Mingan, comprising an extent of territory of about five miles in front by three miles in depth, including the islands in front, and on the north side of the gulf of the St. Lawrence, excepting the island of Anticosti, the whole bounded as follows :

On the south by the river Saint Lawrence, on the west by a straight line of three miles in length, starting from
