

of justice in this province, and as such obtain and receive a diploma from the bâtonnier of such section authorizing him to practise in all courts of justice in this province. Such diploma being in the same form (or as nearly thereto as circumstances may require) as the one provided for by the schedule to chapter seventy-two of the consolidated statutes for Lower Canada,

Form of diploma.

2. Any person who has been called or admitted to the bar of her majesty's superior courts in any of the provinces of the Dominion of Canada, in which the same privileges would be extended to advocates, barristers, attorneys, solicitors and proctors at law from this province shall be entitled to appear and practise as counsels in and before any of her majesty's courts in this province having a penal or criminal jurisdiction.

Reciprocal admission of advocates etc., of other provinces to practice before criminal courts in this province.

CAP. XXI X .

An Act to amend the Act 31 Victoria, Chapter 32, respecting the Fire Marshals for the Cities of Montreal and Quebec, and to change their name of office to that of Fire Commissioner.

[Assented to 5th April, 1869.]

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The fourteenth and fifteenth sections of the act thirty-first Victoria, chapter thirty-two, in so far as the same relate to the city of Montreal, are hereby repealed, and the following provisions substituted:

14. The fire marshal for the city of Montreal, appointed under the said act, shall, from and after the first day of May next, be entitled to an annual salary of sixteen hundred dollars to be divided equally between the incumbents of the said office, so long as the said office is held by more than one person, to be paid by the corporation of Montreal, in quarterly payments; and in addition to the said salary the said fire marshal shall be intitled to receive from the said corporation for every original subpœna twenty cents, and for each copy thereof, five cents, and for every warrant, warrant of arrest, or warrant of commitment, fifty cents.

Corporation of Montreal to pay fire marshals of that city.

15. The said corporation shall be entitled to recover from the Fire Insurance Companies, doing business in the said city, two thirds of the amount so paid by it, in such manner and at such periods as may be determined by by-law to be made for that purpose, and which by-law it is hereby respectively authorized to make, and from time to time to change or alter; and by such by-law the said

Corporation may recover two thirds of amount from insurance companies.
