

CAP. XLIII.

An act to incorporate the Montreal Caledonia Curling Club.

[Assented to, 24th February, 1868.]

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter named are associated Preamble.
 for the purpose of promoting and practising the Scottish national game of curling, by the name of "The Montreal Caledonia Curling Club," which association has existed with the said object in Montreal since the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and whereas the said hereinafter named persons have prayed to be incorporated by the name of "The Montreal Caledonia Curling Club," and it is expedient to grant their prayer; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Alexander W. Ogilvie, Alexander A. Stevenson, William Wilson, Matthew Hutchinson, William McGibbon, William Murdoch, Alexander McGibbon, Alexander C. Hutchinson, David Brown, Thomas McWilliams, and such other persons as are now or shall hereafter become members of the said association, shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate in deed and in name, by the name of "The Montreal Caledonia Curling Club," and shall by the same name, from time to time, and at all times hereafter, be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy, and to have, take and receive to them and their successors, to and for the actual use of the said corporation for the purposes for which they are incorporated, any real and immovable property situate in the city of Montreal or its vicinity, and the same to sell, alienate and dispose of whensoever the said corporation may deem it proper so to do;—and the constitution, rules and regulations now in force touching the admission and expulsion of members, and the management and conduct generally of the affairs and concerns of the said association, in so far as they are not inconsistent with the laws of this province, shall be the constitution, rules and regulations of the said corporation; provided always, that the said corporation may from time to time alter, repeal and change such constitution, rules and regulations, in the manner provided by the constitution, rules and regulations of the said corporation.

Association incorporated.Its powers.Present rules to continue until altered.

2. All property and effects now owned by, or held in trust for, the said association are hereby vested in the said corporation, and shall be applied solely to purposes of the said corporation.

Property of the association devolves to the corporation.

3. No member of the corporation shall be liable for any of the debts thereof beyond a sum which shall be equal to the amount of the original entrance fee, and the annual subscription which may remain unpaid by such member; and any

Liability of members limited.

member of the corporation not being in arrear may retire therefrom, and shall cease to be such member on giving notice to that effect in such form as may be required by the by-laws thereof, and thereafter shall be wholly free from liability for any debt or engagement of the club.

C A P . X L I V .

An act to incorporate the association known as "*La Société des Commis-Marchands de Montréal.*"

[Assented to, 24th February 1868.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS an association known by the name of "*La Société des Commis-Marchands de Montréal,*" for the purpose of aiding and assisting its members in cases of sickness, and to secure similar advantages to the widows and children of deceased members thereof, is in existence in the city of Montreal, and whereas the members of the said association have, by petition, prayed to be incorporated, and it is just to grant the prayer of their petition: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Association incorporated.

1. The following persons, namely, L. G. G. Beliveau, J. H. Dorval, O. Lemieux, F. X. Guérin, A. D. Danis, J. Desautels, Joseph N. Dupuis, A. G. Globensky, Z. Pilon, J. J. Marchand, F. X. Dubuc, J. H. Girard, Z. Poirier, N. Picard, A. Robert, N. Paré, Jos. R. Duchesneau, A. U. Tessier, P. Benoit, O. Lecours, Ang. Couillard, L. Tougas, J. A. Dorais, O. Ethier, Z. Viau, P. Bourdeau, John Halcy, W. Renaud, together with such other persons as are now members of the said association, or who may hereafter become members thereof pursuant to the provisions of this act, shall be and are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic, under the name of "*La Société des Commis-Marchands de Montréal,*" and may, from time to time hereafter, acquire and hold all lands or immovables, in this province, necessary for the use of the said corporation, and the said property to hypothecate, sell, or dispose of, and to acquire other instead thereof, for the same purposes; but the annual value of such property shall not exceed at any time two thousand dollars.

Powers.

Present regulations continue until altered.

2. The rules, by-laws and regulations of the said association existing at the time of the passing of this act, shall be and continue to be the rules, by-laws and regulations of the said corporation until amended, modified or repealed in the manner hereinafter provided; and the said corporation shall have the power to make and establish, from time to time, such rules, by-laws and regulations, consistent with this act and with law, as may be deemed expedient and necessary for the interests and administration of the affairs of the said corpora-
