

## CAP. XXVIII.

An Act to extend the territorial jurisdiction of the Superior and Circuit Courts of the district of Quebec.

[Assented to 21st March, 1889.]

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS, from the situation of certain parishes of the county of Dorchester, it is in the interest of litigants therein that they may be enabled to have recourse to the courts in the district of Quebec as well as to those in the district of Beauce; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Québec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The following article is added after article 2330 of the Revised Statutes of the Province of Quebec:

**" 2330a.** The court in the district of Quebec has concurrent jurisdiction with that of the district of Beauce over all suits and proceedings instituted by or against persons resident in the parishes of St. Anselme, Ste. Claire, St. Malachie, St. Léon de Standon, Ste Hénédine, St. Isidore, St. Bernard, Ste Marguerite, and St. Edouard de Frampton, in the county of Dorchester."

**2.** The following article is added after article 2340 of the said Revised Statutes:

**" 2340a.** The court in the district of Quebec has concurrent jurisdiction with that of the district of Beauce over all suits and proceedings instituted by or against persons resident in the parishes of St. Anselme, Ste Claire, St. Malachie, St. Léon de Standon, Ste Hénédine, St. Isidore, St. Bernard, Ste. Marguerite, and St. Edouard de Frampton, in the county of Dorchester."

Certain arts.  
of R. S. Q.,  
not to apply to  
prothonotary,  
sheriff, &c.,  
of Beauce.

**3.** Articles 1213, 1214 and 1215 of the Revised Statutes of the Province of Quebec do not apply to the prothonotary or the sheriff of the district of Beauce or their deputies.
