CHAPTER 128

An Act respecting the city of Saint-Laurent

[Assented to 18 December 1987]

Preamble

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the city of Saint-Laurent that its charter, chapter 94 of the statutes of 1908 and the Acts amending it, be again amended;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

By-law in force

1. For the purposes of sections 6 and 7 of the Act respecting retirement plans for the mayors and councillors of municipalities (R.S.Q., chapter R-16), by-law number 922 of the city of Saint-Laurent under which the municipality is to join the general retirement plan established under section 2 of the said Act, is deemed to have been passed and put into force on 30 September 1983 and the notices setting forth the intention of the municipality to participate in the general retirement plan transmitted on 17 November 1983 by the members of the council elected for the first time at the 1982 general election, are deemed to have been transmitted on 30 September 1983.

Presumption

Moreover, the by-law and the notices are deemed to have been received by the Commission administrative des régimes de retraite et d'assurances on 30 September 1983.

Contribution

The members of the council referred to in the first paragraph and the municipality of Saint-Laurent shall pay to the Commission, within 30 days of the coming into force of this Act, a contribution equal to what they would have paid for the months of October and November 1983 pursuant to sections 13 and 15 of the Act respecting retirement plans for the mayors and councillors of municipalities.

Provisions
applicable

Section 17 of the said Act applies to the members of the council and to the municipality if they fail or if it fails to pay to the Commission, within the prescribed time, the amounts prescribed under the preceding paragraph.

Financial
assistance
program

2. The council may, by by-law and subject to the conditions it determines, set up a financial assistance program for owners and tenants of dwellings and rented housing who have suffered property damage from the exceptionally heavy rainfall on 14 July 1987.

Funds

The funds allocated to the program shall not exceed one million dollars.

Coming into
force

3. This Act comes into force on 18 December 1987.
