TUESDAY, 9th JANUARY, 1912

TUESDAY, the ninth day of the month of January, in the second year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the fourth session of the twelfth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

The Honorable Legislative Councillors convened were

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir François Langelier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House said :
“ Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod proceed to the Chamber of the Legis-

“ lative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor’s pleasure they
“ attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council.”

WHO BEING COME THERETO

The Honorable Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

“ His Honor the Lieutenant Governor having been informed that the Honorable Mr. *Pelletier*, heretofore Speaker of the Legislative Assembly; had resigned the position, does not see fit to declare the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec until a Speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made, His Honor will declare the causes of his calling this Legislature.”

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o’clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir François Langelier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable *Speaker* of this House said :
“ Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor’s pleasure they
“ attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council.”

Who being come thereto.

The Honorable *C. Delâge* said :

“ May it please Your Honor, the Legislative Assembly have elected me
“ to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the important duties assigned me. If in the performance of those duties, I should at
“ any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me and not to
“ the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am.”

The Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Mr. *Speaker*,

“ I am commanded by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to declare His Majesty’s entire confidence in your talents, diligence and efficiency to fulfil the important duties of the high office of Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, to which you have been chosen by that House. He doth declare His Majesty’s Royal allowance and confirmation of you, Sir, as Speaker of the Legislative Assembly.”

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The pleasure a Lieutenant Governor cannot avoid feeling at seeing you resume your parliamentary labors, is enhanced two fold in my case, because I have had the honour of sitting in the Legislative Assembly.

If your return here assures me of your valuable assistance, it also recalls the past, the recollection of which will always be pleasant to me.

As this is the first session I am called upon to open since I have presided over the administration of the Province, I wish first of all to pay a tribute to the memory of my distinguished predecessor. After a laborious, devoted and honourable career, Sir Alphonse Pelletier died while still in his country's service. I am convinced that I voice your feelings in expressing our gratitude to him as well as our sorrowful regrets.

For a long while the metropolis chose our Governors General among the *élite* of its statesmen, but never, until last October, had a prince of the blood come here to preside over our country's destinies. By sending one of the most illustrious members of his august family to represent him, our Gracious Sovereign evidently wished to manifest the great interest he takes in us and acknowledge at the same time the ever increasing importance assumed by our country among the self-governing nations of the British Empire. We cannot too highly congratulate ourselves on this token of his regard and you will approve of my welcoming the arrival of His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught at Rideau Hall.

You doubtless saw with satisfaction the first reports of the census showing that the number of inhabitants of our Province has greatly increased during the past decade. In fact, among all the older provinces, that of Quebec has the largest increase in population and this has occurred not only in the manufacturing centres and colonization regions, but even in essentially agricultural counties where all the land is under cultivation. Such progress is very encouraging and allows us to hope that, before long, Quebec will have more people than any other of the Canadian provinces.

The clearing of the public domain is being carried on more actively than ever and my ministers fully intend to do all in their power to facilitate the task undertaken by our pioneers.

The time seems to have come for turning to account the vast areas of arable land in the north-west part of our Province. The Colonization Department has already begun the construction of a main artery in the Temiscamingue region and proposes to begin opening a road about one hundred and ten miles long in Abitibi next spring, along which road free grants of lots will be given. It is important, however, that these two regions be placed in communication with consuming and distributing centres by means of railway

lines. Thus, for instance, a line with its terminus at James Bay would greatly promote the development of our farming and industries, while aiding the transportation of the products exported to Europe by the western Provinces. My ministers, therefore, intend urging the construction of new railways through the north of our Province.

The act you passed last year in connection with rural roads is producing good results. My Government is nevertheless of opinion that the campaign it has inaugurated for promoting the improvement of our means of communication would be given a further impetus if the Government were to aid municipalities which borrow money to make their summer roads better. It will therefore ask you to place a considerable appropriation at its disposal to enable it to provide a sinking fund for the loans contracted by municipalities and to contribute to the payment of interest on the same.

I would specially call your attention to the work of the cheese-makers' co-operative syndicate and to the success of the experiments which the Department of Agriculture has made to encourage the growing of clover and fruit trees.

My Government is fully resolved to continue the abolishing of tolls on public bridges and roads.

The technical schools in Quebec and Montreal were opened last autumn and everything leads us to foresee that they will render good service to Canadian industry.

Two new normal schools will be inaugurated next September: one at Joliette and the other at St. Hyacinthe.

My Government will ask you to again increase the appropriations for Education, especially for the encouragement of primary instruction and for increasing the salaries of lady teachers.

An amendment will be submitted to you which will enable school boards to supply text-books to all the children attending the schools under their control.

The growth of the population necessitates the redistribution of our electoral districts. A bill creating new divisions will be laid before you.

Our sanitary service will be re-organized next summer. To that end the Province will be divided into several inspection districts with a hygienist in charge of each. The Government also intends to contribute to the maintenance of hospitals for the treatment of tuberculosis.

Arrangements have been made with the city of Montreal regarding the establishment of a juvenile court which will shortly begin the performance of the duties assigned to it.

You will be called upon to study a Bill to make certain civil suits more expeditious and less costly.

You will also be asked to legislate on several other matters of general interest, especially the electoral system, civil procedure, and the hours of labour in textile factories.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Estimates for the coming year will be submitted to you and I will ask you to approve them.

The accounts for the past year will be submitted to you and you will be pleased, I have no doubt, to note that the receipts have greatly exceeded the expenditure. Everything indicates that the current year will be quite as satisfactory, through the increase in the federal subsidy and the growing revenue from woods and forests.

The balance remaining due on the bonds of 1882, becomes payable on the 1st July next, and I am happy to tell you that the Government will be able to pay such balance, amounting to nearly two and a half millions, without having recourse to a fresh loan.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The matters to be submitted to you are as important as they are numerous. I am confident that you will carefully study them and that your decisions will be inspired by love of justice and solicitude for the public weal.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honorable *George Elie Amyot* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec summoning him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honorable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable *George Elie Amyot*, accompanied by the Honorable Messrs. *Pérodeau* and *Turner*, advanced to the table and the Honorable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows :

The present number of volumes is 77,600, and that of pamphlets is 19,000. The overcrowding that has existed for many years makes itself still more felt. Fortunately the day is drawing nigh when the Librarian will be able, in the new Library, to put a stop to the scattering of the books which is so injurious to the service.

The increase in the appropriation for the purchase of books has enabled the Librarian to acquire a larger number than usual and under the most advantageous conditions possible.

After which, His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the fourth session of the twelfth Legislature of the Province of Quebec with the following Speech :

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

It has afforded me much pleasure to sanction the acts you have passed this session. I must congratulate you on the zeal you display in considering questions of interest to our beloved Province, and I am confident that your labours will be attended by all the good results we expect from them.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

You have voted the necessary appropriations for the administration of public affairs and I thank you in His Majesty's name. I am especially pleased to thank you also for having approved the expenditure of ten million dollars which my Government asked of you for the improvement of roads.

I will see that all these appropriations are judiciously applied and in accordance with the best interests of the Province.

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

I pray for your happiness and that Heaven may shower its gifts on you, on your families and on those whom you represent.

Then the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

It is His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued until Tuesday, the seventh day of May next, to be here held ; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Tuesday, the seventh day of May next.
