TUESDAY, 5th NOVEMBER, 1912

TUESDAY, the fifth day of the month of November, in the third year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the first session of the thirteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

The Honorable Legislative Councillors convened were

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir François Langelier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in

the chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House said :
“Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor’s pleasure
“ they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council.”

WHO BEING COME THERETO :

The Honorable Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

“His Honor the Lieutenant Governor does not see fit to declare the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec until a Speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made, His Honor will declare the causes of his calling this Legislature.”

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o’clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir François Langelier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable *Speaker* of this House said :
“ Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor’s pleasure they
“ attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council.”

Who being come thereto.

The Honorable *C. Delâge* said :

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOR :

“ The Legislative Assembly have elected me their Speaker, though I
“ feel little able to fulfil the important duties thus assigned to me. If in the
“ performance of these duties, I should at any time fall into error, I pray that
“ the fault be imputed to me and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose
“ servant I am and who, through me, the better to enable them to discharge
“ their duty to their King and Country, humbly claim all their undoubted
“ rights and privileges; especially that they may have, freedom of speech in
“ their debates, access to Your Honor’s person at all seasonable times, and
“ that their proceedings may receive from Your Honour the most favourable
“ interpretation.”

The Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council then said :

Mr. *Speaker*,

"I am commanded by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to declare to you that he fully confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative Assembly to His Majesty's person and government; and not doubting that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence, he grants and upon all occasion will recognize and allow their constitutional privileges. I am commanded to assure you that the Legislative Assembly shall have ready access to His Honor upon all seasonable occasions and that their proceedings, as well as your words and actions, will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction."

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Your presence here for the purpose of beginning the work of this new Parliament, affords me the greatest pleasure.

You will no doubt be pleased to learn that the efforts made by my government for the spread of education, are having a good effect. Two normal schools : one at St. Hyacinthe and the other at Joliette, have just been opened for the training of teachers for this Province. Over forty school boards have shared in the appropriations voted in favor of those establishing new commercial academies. The encouragement given to municipalities which increase their teachers' salaries, is beginning to bear fruit and already promises the best of results for the future. It is the firm desire of my government to continue the policy it has inaugurated and to do everything in its power to further improve our educational system.

The first French-speaking Congress was held in Quebec last June and we gladly welcomed the presence of important personages on that occasion. It is to be hoped that the study made by it of certain problems will help to still more develop education in this Province.

The Parliament grounds are now embellished with the monuments erected to the memory of two of our countrymen. Let us hope that this generous movement will continue and that other monuments will arise throughout the Province to recall the remembrance and patriotism of the illustrious dead who figure in Canadian History.

Thousands of fathers and mothers visited the "Child Welfare Exhibition" in Montreal, which was very successful and cannot fail to contribute largely to the decrease of infantile mortality. My Government has noticed with pleasure the interest aroused by that exhibition and proposes to call your attention to the measures to be taken to render it as effective as possible.

A commission was appointed to inquire into the liquor traffic, and the changes which it is advisable to make in the laws concerning it. That commission has begun its labours and will pursue them without delay.

Colonization is developing greatly and an increasing number of letters-patent are being issued every year. Land in Abitibi seems especially to be sought for by settlers and, notwithstanding the difficulties of transportation, a number of location tickets have already been issued in the belt through which the Transcontinental railway runs. My Government is taking an active interest in our pioneers' work and it is its desire to open up new roads so that this fertile country may be more easy of access.

The weather has not been very favourable for farming during the past season; nevertheless, dairying has certainly been more remunerative than ever. It is pleasing to be able to state that the care taken in the classification of butter and cheese has greatly tended to increase the profits of manufacturers of good products. The Government intends to continue to maintain a close supervision over such classification within the scope of its jurisdiction.

The Commission appointed to revise the Municipal Code has completed its labours. Its report will be submitted to your consideration and you will have to decide to what extent it is expedient to adopt the suggestions it contains.

The teaching of housekeeping is very popular in our rural districts, and several new housekeeping schools have accordingly been opened during the year.

The buildings of the agricultural college at Ste. Anne de la Pocatière are now finished. A large number of students will obtain practical and theoretical knowledge there and, at the same time, will acquire a taste for farming.

The commission on running waters has drawn up a report which will be laid before both Houses.

The work of the betterment of our roads has been actively pushed. A number of municipalities have already availed themselves of the advantages offered and many others will do so next spring. The Government proposes to devote special attention to our rural highways.

Considerable damage is done every year by fire in small towns and villages. The Government will submit a Bill to facilitate the organization of a system of fire protection in such municipalities.

The wealth of our forests, mines and hunting territories in southern Ungava and in the northern section of the former Province of Quebec, is often threatened through the imprudence and wilful neglect of prospectors. My Government will see that all the riches of that region are protected.

My Government intends to promote, as is done in certain countries, the establishment of public and private parks where game and fur-bearing animals can multiply.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The estimates for the coming, and the Public Accounts for the past year will be laid before you. You will note with pleasure, by the latter, that, on the first of July, the Province paid off the balance of the loan of 1882, namely : \$2,405,580.00 without incurring fresh liabilities.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will be called upon to legislate on various matters of a public nature. You will specially be asked to pass a Bill providing administrative organization for Ungava and one to amend the Good Roads' Act, 1912, in order to make it more effective and to further stimulate the improvement of our highways, and also to consider a Bill respecting the establishment of a bureau of Statistics.

I am convinced that you will devote all proper attention and care to the study of these matters with a view solely to the welfare of the people and of the Province.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honorable *Louis Philippe Berard* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec summoning him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honorable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable *Louis Philippe Berard*, accompanied by the Honorable Messrs. *Pérodeau* and *Turner*, advanced to the table and the Honorable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows :
