TUESDAY, 15th MARCH, 1910

TUESDAY, the fifteenth day of the Month of March, in the tenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord Edward VII, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the second session of the twelfth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Charles Alphonse Pantaléon Pelletier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,  
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

I heartily welcome you on your return here to resume your parliamentary labours.

You were no doubt pleased to hear of the cordial reception given my Prime Minister and two of your colleagues in Toronto, last December. Such manifestations clearly show the sincere friendship the people of Ontario have for us, and I am convinced that I but voice your opinion by expressing our gratitude to them.

For some time our right to certain powers in connection with the incorporation of companies, has been contested. On the twenty-ninth of this month representatives of the provinces will meet at Ottawa to discuss the matter with the Federal authorities. It is to be hoped that a solution will be found which will fully safeguard our rights.

My Ministers have had conferences with the Canadian Government respecting the annexation of Ungava and they have reason to believe that such annexation will shortly be an accomplished fact.

The printing of the Revised Statutes is now finished. A proclamation announcing their being put into force, will shortly be published.

The Public Utilities Commission is now organized and everything tends to show that it will be of great benefit to our people.

Commissions have also been appointed to study the abolishing of tolls and the struggle against tuberculosis. These commissions are actively pursuing their labours and the information they will gather will certainly be very useful to you.

You will again be called upon to increase the appropriations for primary education and to authorize the payment of higher salaries to school inspectors and to the professors of normal schools.

You will also be asked to vote larger grants to the agricultural school of Ste. Anne la Pocatière to help it to improve its equipment and its course of study.

My Government will also submit to you new measures for the improvement of dairy products.

The number of letters patent granted to settlers on public lands, increases year by year and my Ministers intend to second the work of our pioneers by carrying on more vigorously than ever the making of roads in colonization centres.

The development of the northwest of the Province has necessitated the establishment of additional courts. A bill creating a new judicial district in that region will be submitted to your consideration.

You will be called upon to consider a bill for the establishment of a special court for juvenile offenders.

The reorganization of our civil and criminal courts and the establishment of a police service for the whole Province, are matters which you will be asked to study and to which I am sure that you will devote special attention.

In order to obtain accurate information regarding the value of the Chibougamau mining lands, my Government has instructed experts to explore that region and to make a circumstantial report on their exploration and discoveries.

You will be asked to authorize the foundation of a School of Forestry.

It becomes more and more imperative that you should study the question of regulating the flow of the waters of certain rivers, and I rely upon your devoting special attention to this problem.

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

The accounts for the past year will be distributed to you and you will be pleased, I have no doubt, to note that the receipts have greatly exceeded the expenditure. Everything tends to show that the results for the current year will be still more satisfactory.

The estimates for the coming year will be submitted to you and I will ask you to approve them.

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,*

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

You will be asked to legislate upon various matters of general interest, such as mines, agricultural associations and bulk sales.

I am confident that you will carefully study all the questions that will be submitted to you and I pray that your decisions may be inspired by the desire to do justice and to promote the public weal.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honorable *Achille Bergerin* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal summoning him to the Legislative Council of the Province of Quebec.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honorable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable *Achille Bergevin*, accompanied by the Honorable Messrs. *Pérodeau* and *Garneau, E. B.*, advanced to the table and the Honorable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows :

KNOW YE, that as well for the special trust and confidence We have manifested in you as for the purpose of obtaining your advice and assistance in all weighty and arduous affairs which may the State and Defence of Our Province of Quebec, concern, We have thought fit to summon you to the Legislative Council of Our said Province, and we do appoint you thereto for the Division of *Rougemont*, in our Province of *Quebec*, in the place of the Honorable *François Gosselin*, deceased, and We do command you the Honorable *Ernest Choquette*, that all difficulties and excuses whatsoever laying aside you be and appear for, the purpose aforesaid, in the Legislative Council of Our said Province at all times whensoever and wheresoever our Legislature or Parliament of our said Province may be therein convoked and holden, and this you are in nowise to omit.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said Province of *Quebec*, to be hereunto affixed: WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Well Beloved, the Honorable SIR CHARLES ALPHONSE PANTALEON PELLETIER, Knight, Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, member of our Privy Council for Canada, Lieutenant Governor of Our Province of *Quebec*.

The Honorable the *Speaker* laid before the House the Report of the Librarian of the Legislature for the year 1909-10, which report was read as follows :

*To the Honorable Speaker and Members  
of the Legislative Council.*

The Librarian has the honor to submit his report for the recess of 1909-1910.

Since the opening of the last session of the Legislature, the Librarian has acquired 1600 volumes and 200 pamphlets by purchase, exchange or gift.

The present number of volumes is 74,600 and of pamphlets 18,600.

The Librarian wishes to inform the Honorable members that since 1892, the date of his entry into office, he has increased the number of books to a rather remarkable extent. Thus from 33,800 volumes of which the whole library then consisted, it has now reached the figure of 74,600. This is an increase of 40,800, with an annual appropriation of \$2,000.00.

The Librarian has been obliged to put a rather considerable number of volumes in rooms in the attics in which several thousands of the works less frequently consulted were already accumulated. Such a precautionary measure was necessitated through the ever increasing overcrowding of the library.

It will also enable us to wait until a new building is erected to hold all these works and make them more accessible to those who may wish to consult them.

After which, His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the second session of the twelfth Legislature of the Province of Quebec with the following Speech :

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,*

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

Before closing this session, I wish to congratulate you on the attention you have devoted to the study of the questions submitted to you and which, with the spirit of justice that has inspired your decisions, is a warranty of the efficacy of the laws you have passed. I have no doubt, therefore, that they will be productive of the happiest results.

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

In His Majesty’s name, I thank you for having placed at his disposal the appropriations needed for the administration of the Province. You may rest assured that they will be expended with a wise economy.

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,*

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

As you are about to separate to return to your homes, I pray for your happiness and beg God to shower His benefits on your families and on all the inhabitants of this Province.

Then the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,*

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor’s will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Wednesday, the 12th July next, to be here held : and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Wednesday, the 12th July next.
