TUESDAY, 20th NOVEMBER, 1894.

TUESDAY, the TWENTIETH day of the month of NOVEMBER in the fifty eighth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, being the fourth session of the eighth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Joseph Adolphe Chapleau, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable *Speaker* of this House said : " Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and acquaint that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

It gives me much satisfaction to see you assembled at the seat of Government to commence the labours of this fourth session of the Legislature and to study the questions which interest this Province.

Since last session, the sister colonies of Australasia and the Cape of Good Hope have sent delegates to Canada to consider the means of establishing commercial relations between their countries and ours. The Imperial Government, appreciating the importance of this step at its proper value, lent its aid by sending a high personage as its official delegate. These distinguished visitors, after a prolonged conference with the Canadian representatives, agreed upon a plan of action, the execution of which will confer great benefits upon all the colonies interested and upon the Empire. All of them praised our political organization and the various resources possessed by our country. Let us hope they will retain a pleasant remembrance of the welcome they received in this Province.

The Commercial treaty negotiated between France and Canada is the first step in a direction wherein our Province will find new elements of progress, for there must be advantages to be derived from the establishment of trade relations with so populous and so rich a country, whose prosperity rests upon such solid foundations.

I notice with pleasure that agricultural progress is becoming, day by day, more apparent. Our farmers are rapidly adopting new methods to make their farming more remunerative. The ever-increasing number of agricultural clubs and societies and the universal encouragement given to the Agricultural journals are evidence of the intelligent vigour of this movement.

The last statistics show that fourteen hundred and fifty butter and cheese factories have been in operation during the year ; and to this industry, the success of which is beyond a doubt, we can now add that of beet root sugar which, after so many attempts, seems solidly established in the Province.

It is my duty to say that, in these important achievements, the efforts of the State have been liberally seconded. While agricultural missionaries went through our country parts, preaching this new crusade, the bishops themselves did not consider it beneath their dignity to preside at the larger agricultural conventions.

I have myself observed with pleasure the admirable example given by the establishment of the model farm at Oka. The people cannot forget this great encouragement given to the work of the majority of its children.

Colonisation feels the effect of this great agricultural movement. Never before have our lands been more sought for by settlers. My Government has considered it its duty to keep open the main arteries leading to the forest and we are happy to say that our efforts have been useful to so many. This is a path in which we cannot advance too far.

An important mission was confided since last session to the Assistant-Commissioner of Agriculture whose report will be submitted to you and you will find in it valuable information connected with Agriculture.

This marked progress we have made in Agriculture leads us to hope that our Province will have a large share of the benefits which Canada expects to derive from the extension of its commercial relations with France and the British Colonies. Therefore, nothing remains in the condition of the other Provinces which this Province can envy. As regards the prosperity of the people, we have the public utterances of the managers of our great financial institutions.

The Public Accounts for the year 1893-94 will show you that the Province has lost nothing of the results which a prudent administration had procured for it during the previous year. My Government has been able to increase the expenditure in favour of Agriculture without exceeding and even without reaching the sum of the general expenditure for the year 1892-93.

The budget of this year will meet the last payments which my government intends to make for the extraordinary works mentioned in the preamble of the act authorizing a loan of ten million dollars passed in 1890 and this justifies the hope that the Province will not require the whole of the loan authorized by that act.

There is every reason to believe that between now and next session, the accounts between this Province and the Government of Canada and the Province of Ontario, which have been submitted to arbitration, will be decided and the arrangements which the financial position of the Province still requires may be completed. My Government will then be able to say to what extent it can meet new requirements, while reducing present taxation.

To pay the floating debt and the railway subsidies, the Government, exercising the powers granted by the act of 1890, borrowed a sum of three

million dollars, and in order to meet the bond issued in July 1893 to pay off the loan of four million dollars negotiated in 1891 with " Le Crédit Lyonnais " and " La Banque de Paris et des Pays Bas, " placed itself in communication with these two establishments. Certain conditions which are to serve as the basis for a loan to be affected under the section nine of the act 57 Victoria chapter 2, have been accepted by both sides and a draft of a contract drawn up in consequence. This draft, as well as the contract for last winter's loan, will be laid before the Houses with the correspondence connected therewith. I hope they will convince you that my Government has made as advantageous arrangements as circumstances permitted.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The Public Accounts will be submitted to you, as usual, and you will be requested to vote new Supplies for the requirements of the Public Service.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

You will be invited to legislate upon various subjects and in particular on libel by newspapers, on the prevention of bribery at elections, on the qualification of jurors and on the redemption of rents in the Magdalen Islands.

My Government has resolved to set aside a certain portion of the public domain as a National Park for the preservation of forests and fish and game.

A bill to that effect will be submitted to you.

The work of the Commission appointed to codify, the Code of Civil Procedure will be submitted to you. It will take only a few months for the Commission to finish its task.

I leave you now to your important labours, and I pray that your deliberations may be guided by wisdom and the purest patriotism.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor to retire.

The Honorable Mr *Chapais* presented a Bill (A) intituled : " An Act respecting agriculture. "

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honorable Speaker reported the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honorable Mr *Chapais*, seconded by the Honorable Mr *Wood*, it was

Ordered, that the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor be printed in both languages for the use of members.

On motion of the Honorable Mr *Chapais*, seconded by the Honorable Mr *Wood*, it was

Ordered, that this House do take into consideration the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, to-morrow.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Chapais* seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Wood*, it was

Ordered, that all the Legislative Councillors present during the session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and the privileges of the Legislature, and that the said committee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

Then, the House adjourned until to-morrow at three o'clock, P. M.

Mr. Speaker laid upon the table the report of the Librarian of the Legislature which reads as follows :

The librarian of the Legislature has the honor to submit the following report for the recess of 1894.

Since last session the librarian has had two rooms arranged and furnished for all the bound newspapers which formally encumbered the alcoves of the library. Thanks to this new arrangement it will be easier to consult these volumes in future,

The librarian has arranged in a branch library in the attics all the newspapers which his slender resources do not allow him to get bound. These newspapers are piled on shelves in chronological order, year by year so that they may be much more easily consulted.

A second branch library, opposite the preceding one, contains the parliamentary literature and public archives of the British colonies, the United States and the various countries with which the library of the Legislature has constant relations and a mutually beneficial system of exchange.

The printing of a card catalogue is pretty well advanced. This system which is adopted almost everywhere, without being a model of its kind, suffices for the general requirements of the library. It is much less costly than the usual kind of catalogue, which, in addition to the original cost of printing, necessitates a supplement and additional expense every year. Both systems combined are desirable and they will become still more so as the library increases.

The library has since the beginning of the session of 1893, been enriched by 2125 bound volumes and 530 pamphlets, most of which are also bound. Amongst the most important acquisitions is the *Quebec Gazette* from 1796 to 1855.

The total number of volumes in the Library is 46,700.

That we are happy to learn that the Public Accounts for the year 1893-94 will show us that the Province has not impaired the position which a prudent administration secured for it during the previous year, and that the Government has been able to increase the expenditure in favour of Agriculture without exceeding and even without reaching the sum of the general expenditure for the year 1892-93.

11. That we learn with pleasure that the budget of this year will meet the last payments which the Government intends to make for the extraordinary works mentioned in the preamble of the act authorizing a loan of ten million dollars passed in 1890, which justifies the hope that the Province will not require the whole of the loan authorized by that act.

12. That we learn with satisfaction that there is every reason to believe that, before next session, the accounts between this Province, the Government of Canada and the Province of Ontario, which have been submitted to arbitration, will be settled ; that the arrangements which the financial position of the Province still requires may be completed and that the Government will then be able to say to what extent it can meet new requirements, while reducing present taxation.

13. That we learn with interest that, to pay the floating debt and the railway subsidies, the Government, exercising the powers granted by the act of 1890, borrowed a sum of three million dollars ; that, in order to meet the bonds, issued in July, 1893, to pay off the loan of four million dollars, negotiated in 1891 with "Le Credit Lyonnais" and "La Banque de Paris et des Pays Bas," it placed itself in communication with these two establishments ; that certain conditions which are to serve as the basis for a loan to be effected under section nine of the act 56 Victoria, chapter 2, have been accepted by the parties and a draft contract drawn up in conse-

quence, and that this draft, as well as the contract for last winter's loan, will be laid before the Houses with the correspondence connected therewith, and that we will examine these documents with the greatest care so as to decide whether the Government has made as advantageous arrangements as circumstances permitted.

14. That we learn with interest that we will be invited to legislate upon various matters and in particular on libel by newspapers, on prevention of bribery at elections, on the qualification of jurors and on the redemption of rents in the Magdalen Islands.

15. That we learn with pleasure that the Government has resolved to set aside a certain portion of the public domain as a National Park for the preservation of the forest, fish and game, and that a bill for that purpose will be submitted to us.

16. That we are pleased to learn that the work of the Commission to codify the laws relating to Civil Procedure will be submitted to us, and that it will take only a few months for the Commission to finish its task.

17. That we join with His Honor in his prayer, on leaving us to our important labours, that our deliberations may be guided by wisdom and the purest patriotism.

The committee, appointed to examine and report on the contingent accounts of the Legislative Council for this session, have the honor of presenting their second report.

The committee have examined the accounts and disbursements of the clerk from the first November 1893, date up to which the accounts were last audited, to the first November 1894.

The clerk has rendered a detailed account with vouchers numbered from 97 to 44³ inclusive of his disbursements from the first November 1893 to the first July 1894, and from 1 to 82 inclusive, from the first July 1894 to first November 1894, showing the disbursements of the Legislative Council between the said dates to be (\$38,471.41) thirty eight thousand four hundred and seventy one dollars and forty one cents, of which (\$33,111.76) thirty three thousand one hundred and eleven dollars and seventy six cents were disbursed from the said first November 1893 to the first July 1894, and (\$5,359.65) five thousand three hundred and fifty nine dollars and sixty five cents were disbursed from the first July to the first November last (1894).

The committee have examined the cash book kept by the clerk of the Legislative Council and have found that the entries of payment are correctly made and accompanied with vouchers.

The committee suggest that in future the pages of the cash book be numbered and that opposite each entry in the said book, the year, month and date be given.

The committee have examined the provincial Auditor's report regarding the audit of the accounts of the clerk of this House ordered by the Speaker; and your committee consider that the fact of official cheques being refused by the bank justified the Speaker in calling for an explanation from the clerk and in ordering an audit when he found that the clerk and the bank did not agree as to the balance on hand, and your committee approve of the suggestions contained in the said report.

According to this report and under the instructions given by the Speaker, your committee consider that in future, the clerk will have to send his pass book to the bank to be balanced at the end of each month, as is the custom in the other public departments, in order to avoid the errors which are much to be regretted, and which are mentioned in the said report, submitted to the committee.

According to the said instructions, no payment will be made in future without the approval of the Speaker of this House, with the exception of the pay list of the permanent employees of the Legislative Council, cab hire, telegrams, freight and express charges.

Your committee desire to mention that it is important that the clerk should comply with the provisions of article 153 of the Revised Statutes of the Province of Quebec, which requires that the allowance for mileage of the members of the Legislative Council should be established and certified by the Speaker of this House.

The following petition was brought up and laid on the table :

By the Honorable Mr. *Archambeault*, of Arthur Gagnon and others.

The Honorable Mr. *de Boucherville*, from the select committee to whom was referred the Bill (No. 14) intituled : "An Act respecting the tenure of lands in the Magdalen Islands" presented the following report :

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

This 9th December, 1894.

The Select committee to whom was referred the Bill (No. 14) intituled : "An Act respecting the tenure of lands in the Magdalen Islands beg to report :

1o That the fact of the Magdalen Islands having been granted to Admiral Isaac Coffin on the 24th April 1793 is proved by the letters-paten themselves, as printed in the document No. 140 printed in the official documents of the Legislative Assembly in 1890.

2o That the fact that at the time of the granting of the said Islands to the said Isaac Coffin the population thereof was about one hundred families, is taken from an official document printed by order of the Legislative Assembly, containing the report of a special committee appointed in 1853, by the Legislative Assembly to make an inquiry on the subject of the tenure of lands in the Magdalen Islands and for other purposes.

30. The fact that long before the said grant and afterwards up to about the year 1831, the occupants of the said Islands had no titles other than possession by themselves as well as by their auteurs, from the first granting of the said Islands by the "La Compagnie de la Nouvelle France" on the 19th January 1663, to sieur Doublet, capitaine de navires, for the purpose of settlement, is also taken from the report of the Special committee of the Legislative Assembly of 1853, as mentioned above and also in the report of Jean Bouffard Esquire, law clerk of the Crown Lands Department and Jules Coté, Esquire, secretary of the mining branch of the same department dated the 26th September 1894, and laid before the Legislative Assembly on the 17th December 1894. The fact of the occupants having no titles before 1831, is mentioned in the report of Messrs Bouffard and Coté. As to the fact of the granting of the said Islands by the "La Compagnie de la Nouvelle France" to sieur Doublet it is proven by the grant itself which is found printed in a report of a special committee of the Legislative Council appointed in 1859 to inquire into the grievances of the inhabitants of the Magdalen Islands, as to the tenure of their lands. This report is printed at length in the Journals of the Legislative Council for 1859.

40. The fact that in 1831 the population of the said Islands was 1757 souls, is also taken from the report of the special Committee of the Legislative Assembly appointed in 1853 which is hereinabove mentioned.

50. The fact that it was only in 1831 that the said Issac Coffin required the occupants of the said Islands to take titles and that from 1831 to 1839, titles of the nature of perpetual leases, leases with an irredeemable ground rent, and emphyteutic leases, were granted, is also taken from the report of the special committee of the Legislative Assembly of 1853, at page 64, and also in the report of Messrs Bouffard and Coté hereinabove mentioned.

60 The fact that the said Isaac Coffin died on the 23rd July 1839, and by his last will dated the 15th March 1839, bequeathed the said Islands to his nephew the late John Townsend Coffin with substitution in favour of Isaac Tristram Coffin his son, and upon the death of the said Isaac Tristram Coffin in favour of the latter's male heirs is established by an authentic copy of the will of the late Isaac Coffin, and taken from a Bill No. 48 of the Legislative Assembly, presented in 1892, at the request of the actual proprietor Sieur Isaac Tristram Coffin which said Bill was afterwards withdrawn by the said Isaac Tristram Coffin.

70 The fact that the said John Townsend Coffin the first institute died on the 29th April 1882 is also taken from the same Bill No. 48 of 1892 hereinabove mentioned.

80 The fact that the said Isaac Tristram Coffin the second institute, has been, since the death of the said John Townsend Coffin in possession of the said Islands is also taken from the Bill No. 48 of 1892 hereinabove mentioned.

9o The fact that the said Tristram Coffin has three male children living who, under the last will of the late Sir Isaac Coffin are the substitutes to the substitution created thereby is also taken from the Bill No. 48 of 1892 hereinabove mentioned.

10 The fact that there are now in the Magdalen Island 820 occupants of lands under various titles, 14 of which are leases for perpetual rents, 12 leases with an unredemable ground rent, and 794 leases in the nature of emphyteutic leases, at a rate generally of twenty cents per acre, is taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté, hereinabove mentioned and laid before the Legislative Assembly the 17th December 1894.

11o The fact that the 14 leases at a perpetual rent were granted by Admiral Sir Isaac Coffin is also taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté hereinabove mentioned.

12o The fact that the 12 leases with an unredemable ground rent were granted by the said John Townsend Coffin, the first institute, is also taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté hereinabove mentioned.

13o The fact that of the 794 leases which are of the nature of emphyteutic leases, 27 were granted by the said John Townsend Coffin, from 185 to 1875 for 99 years, and 771 by the said Isaac Tristram Coffin the second institute during the years 1889 to 1890, also for a term of 99 years is taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté hereinabove mentioned.

14o That the fact that the present system of tenure of lands in the Magdalen Islands has always been a source of uneasiness and discontent with the population of the said Islands, and is hurtful as well to the prosperity, as to the happiness and contentment of its inhabitants is also taken from the documents and reports of the various committees who have studied the question, that is those of 1853—1859 and those printed in the documents No 140 laid before the Legislative Assembly in 1890, and to be found in the sessional documents of 1890, and also in the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté hereinabove mentioned.

15o. The fact that for upwards of fifty years the inhabitants of the said Islands have not leased petitioning the successive governments to replace the system of tenure by lease by one of free tenure, is also taken from the same documents and reports hereinabove mentioned.

16o. The fact that at different times to wit : in 1853 the Legislative Assembly of United Canada, appointed a select committee to study the tenure of lands in the Magdalen Islands, is taken from the report of the committee of 1853, printed by order of the Legislature.

17o. The fact that another committee of the Legislative Council was appointed in 1859, is also taken from the report of the said committee printed in the Journals of the Legislative Council 1859.

18o. The fact that in 1872 another select committee was appointed by the Legislative Assembly to study the tenure of lands in the Magdalen Islands, is also taken from the report of this committee printed in the sessional documents of 1875 and reprinted in 1890 in the document No 140.

19o. The fact that several inquiries with the knowledge of the proprietor or his agent, have been held upon this subject by persons appointed by different governments, and that their reports also recommend the settlement of the question, is also taken from the documents and reports, printed in the documents No. 140 and No. 177 of the Legislative Assembly for 1890.

20o. The fact that the population of the Islands is now over five thousand souls is taken from the documents and reports printed in 1890—(Document 140) and also in the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté of 1894 hereinabove mentioned.

21o. The fact that of the 32,084 acres belonging to the said Isaac Tristram Coffin in the said Islands, 16,474 have been conceded and bring in an annual revenue of \$2,582.00, and 15,590 have not been conceded, is taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté herein above mentioned.

22o. The fact that the present owners and all previous owners have resided in Europe, and have always appointed agents to represent them, is also taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté hereinabove mentioned.

23. The fact that of the various successive owners of the said Islands, one was unwilling and the others were unable to grant titles conferring full ownership upon the occupants, is also taken from the report of Messrs Bouffard and Côté, hereinabove mentioned.

And the committee report the said Bill.

During the course of this laborious session, several measures of importance have engaged your attention and were the object of careful study on your part.

I have especially observed with satisfaction that the vital questions which are so intimately connected with the prosperity of our beloved Province, such as agriculture, the progressive development of our public lands and the preservation of our forest resources, have occupied a large share of your deliberations. The country, will I am convinced, praise the patriotic efforts made by its representatives to solve, in its highest interest questions which are at times so complex in their nature and otherwise so important in their results.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In Her Majesty's name, I thank you for the supplies which you have so generously voted for the various branches of the public service.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

At this moment when you are about separate and return to your homes I wish you every happiness and I pray that God may extent his protection to your families and to all the inhabitants of our faithful and loyal Province.

Then the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Friday, the twenty-second day of February next, to be here held ; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until the twenty-second day of February next.
